## Violations Of The Administrative Procedures Act

When ETNSN Grant Hrdlicka asked Chief Ashcom why his appeal was denied when the nearly identical disciplinary violation appeal by a prior-enlisted Midshipman Candidate was granted, two reasons were given: that ETNSN Grant Hrdlicka's violations occurred later in the year, and that "NAPS is making examples of students in order to stop these alcoholrelated issues at both NAPS and the Naval Academy".

Both reasons provide are blatantly false and in violation of the Administrative Procedures Act. Well over a dozen students were disciplined in the later part of the school year. The vast majority of those students were admitted to the Naval Academy.

Secondly, a dozen and a half students other than ETNSN Grant Hrdlicka were disciplined for alcohol related issues. Again, the vast majority of those students were admitted to the Naval Academy.

ETNSN Grant Hrdlicka was the only student with ONE disciplinary violation DENIED admission to the Naval Academy (two students had additional failing grades).

ETNSN Grant Hrdlicka was the ONLY student to request his constitutional right to consult with an attorney.
